Jason Mastrogiovanni, Assistant Provost of Student Success

- Student Success Collaborative https://studentsuccess.ufl.edu/about/student-success-collaborative/
 - The group has met twice so far. Meetings are held via Zoom, with 60-70 participants per meeting. The
 goal of the group is to discover challenges, raise concerns, review policies, and share positive issues, as
 well. Meetings are meant to be open, with participants driving the agenda, and he will facilitate.
- UFSS just hired a new Communications Coordinator, and this will be announced soon.
- Academic Operations Technology Workgroup –

The group is putting together a list of basic functionality that they think should exist but doesn't. The
goal is to try to find solutions that can help campus-wide, and they have come up with over 100
functionalities that they wish we had. The group is partnering with UFIT to work on enhancements and
will share updates with UAC shortly.

Town Hall Forum Q&A with Nigel & Jason

- With so many separate workgroups going on, how can we ensure that there will still be communication across
 the larger advising community? If your unit has a member participating in any of the groups, they are
 encouraged to share information with your unit. Information will also be shared with Allison and the UAC on a
 regular basis. UFSS is launching a newsletter in the spring to disseminate information more broadly.
 Communication is the key to success, and UFSS is the connective tissue between the advising community and
 campus partners.
- What is your sense of new president's level of support of advising? The focus of the president and his team so
 far has been on bigger picture issues. They haven't gotten to the level of granularity to determine what the role
 of advising is within that. Early indications seem supportive, but we are waiting to see how that manifests. There
 is an opportunity to dream and come up with wish lists since not all decisions have been made yet. Get involved
 in the UAC and UFSS workgroups to put forth ideas.
- What is your understanding of the future of UFOnline as a standalone unit? No specific insight to share, other than the idea that offering courses with different modalities (online, hybrid, etc.) seems to be favored by the administration.
- Do we enforce the policy of students not being permitted to submit CLEP exams after their first term? Do we
 think it's a reasonable policy? It was noted that there is an exception for CLEP for Civic Literacy (POS2041 and
 AMH2020) and those CLEP exams can be taken and submitted as late as their final semester for Civic Lit. It was
 also shared that students can receive an online voucher to take CLEP exams for free if they complete Modern
 State's online prep course.
- Are there updates on plans for Dr. Lindner's position, especially in regard to UFSS? The Provost's Office is being
 reviewed as a whole right now, and there are likely to be some changes. There will not be an interim position
 after Dr. Lindner leaves. Her last day will be announced soon, but she has generally said it will be at the end of
 this year. UFSS will not be changing.
- Regarding the upcoming UFSS advising newsletter: what sort of frequency will it have? It will be put out weekly
 on Tuesdays, with a submission deadline of Monday. It will cover advising news, perhaps a UAC corner, etc. It
 will be a place for advisors to go back and look to see what's coming up, announce new advisors who have
 arrived, share birthdays of advisors, etc.
- Jason wants advisors to be comfortable reaching out to him and welcomes advisors to send a Teams message if they have any questions.
