#### **Program Recommendations**

- 5. Addition of "Integrative" specialization for the BS Animal Sciences in the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences [R]
  - https://secure.aa.ufl.edu/Approval/reports/17976
  - Summary: Requests additional of a fourth specialization, "Integrative." The rationale for this new specialization is to provide more flexibility for students wishing to focus on the discipline, rather than an animal species. These students will not pursue professional programs in the health sciences and desire deeper integration of animal sciences with advance training in areas, such as AI, reproduction, animal behavior, environmental sciences, etc., via coursework offered by other programs.

- O The Review Subcommittee recommends considering name change to "Integrative Animal Sciences." "Integrative" may be too general and not sufficient for understanding the purpose of the specialization. NOTE: An alternative name might be "Interdisciplinary," which might more accurately describe the intent of this new specialization.
- As this is a new specialization proposal, the catalog copy should not be a tracked changes document. Please upload the final version for review.
- Semester 6: Please provide more information regarding ANS4941 with 3-8 credits. Leaving it as 3 credits would meet the 120 total requirement. Are there expectations that students will take the course for increased credit? Will this be required?
- o Please provide Overview, Critical Tracking for catalog.
- An Academic Learning Compact will also need to be submitted through a separate request.

- Please provide more information on how courses from other programs are selected and allowed to satisfy requirements.
- o The approval form entry states that few students are expected to follow this new specialization. Given the effort and resources needed to create and sustain specializations across multiple offices on campus, would a more efficient approach be to allow students to pursue an existing specialization while selecting elective coursework in the focus areas (AI, reproduction, animal behavior, environmental science, etc.)? For example, the animal Biology specialization has ~38 credits of electives that students begin taking in Semester 1.

However, given the web site presence of this program on the DCP web site, this request seems to be a reaffirmation of an existing combination degree program. Which is correct, and, if a new program, have students already been admitted to this not-yet-approved program?



#### 7. Revisions to the Biomechanics Minor in the College of Engineering [R] [CA]

- Summary: This request seeks revisions to the Biomechanics minor in order to accommodate advances in the field since the original creation of the minor. Four additional core courses are added to the existing three, and students will be required to take 3 of the core courses instead of 2 they currently must take (9 credits versus 6). Some elective courses are removed. APK2100C or 2105C are moved from required core courses to elective courses, and five new elective courses are added to total to 13 elective courses. Students then take two additional elective courses.

- O Please clarify the layout and credit requirements, the current proposal has a credit range of 9-22 credits for completion of the minor. [The request has been updated to better explain the desired minor. Please see the updated request. Email, 2/14/23]
- If a student selects just a portion of the top-level courses, what is differentiating these courses from being electives. [The remainder would be eligible as electives.]
- The Review Subcommittee recommends creating a list of courses for approved electives and stating "Select five." [That would work in a

- perfect world, when all courses are offered every semester and do not conflict with each other. That's not reality for us.]
- O It appears that students are being told "If taking 5 of the top courses, then then no electives are required, but if taking only 3 of the top courses, then 7 credits of electives are required. Please provide more information regarding the purpose of these two options. [Ideally, we want the students to take the core courses. It is not a perfect world, so we are trying to accommodate other options from other departments that are acceptable. As is, we are overwhelmed with typically at least one petition from each student.]
- O I suggest that the Approved Elective credit total is listed as 6 with the total credit hours of the minor as 15. Students may opt to take two 4-credit hour electives, thus pushing the total credits to 17, but the minimum elective credits would remain 6. You may add a footnote below the table in the catalog that states that, if students select elective courses that total more than 6 credit hours, then the total credit hours for the minor exceeds 15.

#### Comments:

Career prep course and the elective. Will these remain in Semester 3?
[The prep course should be taken between Semester 3 or 5. Many of our students transfer to UF so they start with us in semester 5 after earning their AA. For students that start with us as Freshman we recommend semester 3 as the best fit for the Career Preparation class.

The Department Elective can be in any semester from 3 on, wherever it needs to be. Email response, 2/14/23]

Because we have several degree specializations there are always classes available that will be outside of the specific degree requirements of individual students. In addition, there are AI in THEM classes that are not

- specialization specific that can be used as electives as well as our study abroad classes.]
- Has Accounting been made aware of this proposed change? [Yes, Dr
   McGill has been informed and has acknowledged the requested change.]

Students who don't have any unexcused absences or latenesses won't see any change to it during the semester. For each unexcued absence or lateness, I deduct 10 or 5 points, respectively, from that 100 for each occurrence. The students see that readily, and so they are reminded that they are being held accountable. This is explained during the first class and repeatedly.]
