Resolution Affirming the Qualifications of the University of Florida Provost

PREAMBLE: The University of Florida Faculty Senate looks forward to welcoming our institution's next Provost. As a land-, sea-, and space- grant public university comprised of 16 academic colleges and more than 150 research centers and institutes, with an extensive health-sciences enterprise, UF has a responsibility to recruit and retain a top-notch Provost candidate with a strong academic background.

WHEREAS the University of Florida has opened a search for its next Provost,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Provost should have the following qualifications:

- 1. The Provost should be an educator of national stature with a terminal degree in their field, demonstrated intellectual leadership, and with internationally recognized research or scholarly achievements who will continue to advance the academic distinction of the University of Florida.
- 2. The Provost should have successful administrative experience at an AAU/R-1 university with undergraduate and graduate programs.
- 3. The Provost should have demonstrated a commitment to excellence in teaching, research, service, and a willingness to champion genuine innovation in all three areas.
- 4. The Provost should have demonstrated a strong commitment to fostering academic freedom and to ensuring the right of all members of the University community to express their academic and professional views openly.
- 5. The Provost should have demonstrated a strong commitment to faculty governance and transparency in all matters, including academic standards, policies, and rewards with faculty playing an integral role in all decision-making processes that affect the academic and working environment of the University.
- 6. The Provost should have demonstrated a commitment to initiatives that eliminate undue disparity, that encourage dignity and professionalism, and that promote variation in thought and experience.
- 7. The Provost should have the demonstrated ability to articulate an institution's mission, values, and needs clearly and to communicate them persuasively to all external and internal constituencies.
- 8. The Provost should commit to the University's role as a public land grant institution and recognize that the University is a partner with the communities in which it serves.
