




GPA by Gender

Graduation Success Rate (vs FGR)

FGR


- Tracks graduation over 6 years
- Federally mandated calculation for all schools that offer athletic scholarships.
- Counts all transfers as academic failures
 - Essentially measures the percentage of students who complete a bachelors degree from their initial school within six years

• GSR

- Tracks graduation over 6 years
- NCAA DI metric
- Accounts for transfers in/out and mid-year enrollees.
- Student-athletes who depart a school while in good academic standing (would have met NCAA's and school's progress-toward-degree standards) are passed from that school's cohort to another school's cohort.
- Student-athletes who depart in poor academic standing are deemed non-graduates by both the Federal rate and the GSR.


UF vs. Peers Federal Graduation Rate

Single Year Student Body Federal Graduation Rate





GSR by Gender of Athlete


Single Year Graduation Success Rate


Annual Progress Rate (APR)

- Based on RETENTION and ELIGIBILITY each SEMESTER
 - Each student-athlete receiving athletically related financial aid earns one point for staying in school and one point for being academically eligible.
 - A team's total points are divided by points possible and then multiplied by 1,000 to equal the team's Academic Progress Rate.
 - In addition to a team's current-year APR, its rolling four-year APR is also used to determine penalties/accountability.




Single Year APR

Single Year Academic Progress Rate (APR)




Single Year APR by Gender

NCAA Governance Update

Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL)

Three elements that make up a legal concept known as "right of publicity"

 Compensation for third-party endorsements related to athletics, without school or conference involvement.

 Compensation for other student-athlete opportunities, such as social media, new businesses, and personal appearances, without institutional involvement or the use of trademarks/logos.

NIL- What happened in past year?

State Laws

• June 2020

- Florida passed a state law to allow athletes to begin profiting from their name, image and likeness beginning in July 2021.
- 5 other states have legislation in progress that also has an effective date of July 2021.
- 18 other states have legislation approved or moving through the process that go into effect in 2022 or later.

NCAA

• July 2020

 NCAA president repeats a request for congressional help in creating a federal NIL law while appearing at a Senate hearing in Washington, D.C

January 2021

- The NCAA's Division 1 Council indefinitely delays its vote on name, image and likeness rules
- Expected to vote on their NIL rules in July 2021

NIL- What happens next?

- Federal Legislation
 - Several US Senators and US
 Representatives have advanced
 NIL bills
- "While several federal options have been proposed, it's becoming increasingly likely that state laws will start to go into effect before a nationwide change is made."
