Administrative Burdens

Recommendations to:

- Streamline trainings, reduce notifications, and create a system for periodic review of training requirements
- Reduce UF Engaged reporting to 2x from 4x per year
- Pilot proposal to remove layers of pre-approvals in UF Go to allow delegates to do all booking – Reminder that you can book in UF Go prior to approval
- Increase P-card limits for faculty that are having trouble.
- Investigating whether we can establish 6 or 7 testing centers and embed DRC and administrative staff to facilitate tests and makeup assignments
- Advocating for streamlining course and program approval processes and reporting of program assessments for accreditation purposes
- Simplifying the faculty activity reporting by consolidating to a single system to combine effort, OPT, annual reviews, outside disclosures, and the 12-hour rule
- Create a faculty-led office of operational excellence to continue the momentum through to implementation
