Updates | Dr. Lauren Solberg

- Syllabus Link
 - Requests that syllabi have a one website/link that shows up in the student's Canvas and One.UF. This One Link will house all the extra information needed on syllabi, such as Honesty Policy, Evaluations, Attendance, Wellness, etc. This way that one link will always be updated. This will ease the burden on faculty
 - o PCC Voted in favor of the one link on syllabi, with the caveat that syllabus will be able to add "verbiage" language for accreditation purposes
- HB 1321: Higher Education
 - o Standardized Test to medical institutions and P/F (Pass/Fail) was removed.
- SB 1710: Prohibitions and Limitations on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion and Requirements for Medical Institutions of Higher Education
 - All courses will need to be publicly posted and provide all instructional materials *45 days in advance
 - This has been adjusted to now only providing syllabi 10 days in advance.
