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General Education Committee Minutes

April 16, 2010, Began @ 8:30

- 1. Minutes from the March 19th meeting were approved.
- 2. Committee reports: Robert Thomson reported that the Academic Policy Council meeting's discussion focused on courses in the medical area and there was no business relevant to the General Education Committee.
- 3. The GE Sub-Committee on Assessment will meet this Tuesday, April 20th and Theresa Vernetson as GEC liaison to the University Academic Assessment Committee (UAAC) reported that the two meetings held to date included discussion of the Academic Learning Compacts (ALC) and the variations these contained across campus. There is no form of collection of the information obtained from the ALC's from individual colleges and the first initiative involves identifying a representative or point person to collect the data.
- 4. The GE Sub-Committee on Policy & Procedures, Chaired by Joe Wilson, read the distributed six (6) points they submitted for acceptance by the committee. Minor changes included 1.) Identify acceptance of the proposed policies & procedures with an effective date at "the beginning of its next meeting". 2.) Identify a reasonable amount of time in #5 in reference to proxy voting to read 7 days. Members present voted and all eleven voting members approved.
- 5. Dr. Vandana Baweja addressed the committee to discuss ARC3XXX, Sustainable Architecture and acknowledged the bibliography of reading materials would be detailed to identify the specific readings for the weekly topics. The committee would need to see the details of how the course would engage the students to meet both the International and Diversity components of general education. Instructor will expand the syllabus to include such information and resubmit to the committee for a vote.
- 6. Two of the three courses submitted for syllabi review received a vote to table. The courses requested continuation of 6,000 words writing credit and Creed Greer and Andy Ogram agreed to meet with the instructors to help clarify some of the assignments receiving word count. With this discussion the Committee once again questioned whether all Gordon Rule writing courses should include an evaluative rubric. Creed Greer and Fiona Barnes will review the University Gordon Rule requirements and make suggestions for Committee review.
