With the help of **Sandra City**, a UF Research Demonstration Project went global for its success in helping reduce complications from ECMO devices.



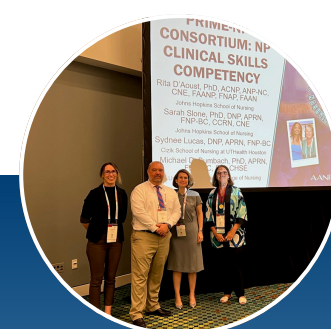
Star Booker was selected as a 2024 American Academy of Nursing Fellow!
